Job Description:

La Ronge EMS & Northern Air Medevac Service is currently looking for three (2) Permanent Part-time (PPT) – ACP or PCP to join our EMS team. La Ronge EMS is a privately run Ambulance service, located in beautiful Northern Saskatchewan close to lakes, resorts ideal for people who love the outdoors. La Ronge is located approximately 2.5 hours North of Prince Albert and 3.5 hours North of Saskatoon. La Ronge EMS is a unionized service that employs approximately 35 staff in a private contract with Health Sciences Association of Saskatchewan (HSAS). La Ronge EMS provides great benefits for all staff along with a Northern living allowance and yearly Northern Retention bonus of \$1900.00 on each anniversary date. La Ronge EMS is one of the busiest rural Paramedic Services in Saskatchewan that covers one of the largest areas in the province both by ground Ambulance while also providing Air Medevac Services to the majority of Northern Saskatchewan as well into some parts of Manitoba and Alberta.

La Ronge EMS responds to over 350 emergency and non-emergency calls and 80-90 Air Medevacs a month averaging over 4000 calls per year. Shifts include 12-hour Day and Nights along with 24 hours on call. La Ronge EMS Staffs 3 ground Ambulances, 1 Supervisor Unit and 3 dedicated Air Medevac Crews.

Part-time position (PPT) consist of mostly on call shifts with scheduled Day and Night shifts to cover Holidays, STAT days, and any request for leave from Full time staff. Part-time Staff average \$70,000 to \$80,000 a year, following the HSAS pay scale, \$5.00 an hour on call including shift difference and weekend premiums along with that comes a Medevac Bonus of \$60.00 per flight plus much more.

Successful applicants must hold a valid Saskatchewan College of Paramedics (SCoP) license or in the process of obtaining one. Applicants must also have a good understanding of the following,

- Saskatchewan College of Paramedics Protocols and understanding full scope of Practice applicable to level of training.
- Saskatchewan Ambulance Act, Traffic Safety Act, and Paramedic Act.

Applicants must also be able to meet the requirements of the company:

- The Ability to work to the full scope of practice (BLS or ALS)
- Excellent verbal and written communication
- Able to adapt to the possibility of heavy workload
- Able to work as part of the health care team in the Pre-hospital and Hospital settings
